## The Venues

### Chester – YHA Trafford Hall

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### York – YHA York

# York History Activities

## York Castle Museum

A visit to York Castle Museum will bring history to life! Speak to the residents of Victorian York, clamber through a First World War trench, and meet the inmates of York Castle Prison. Here you can see hundreds of years of York's history in one place – from the world-renowned Victorian cobbled street Kirkgate, to meeting the infamous prisoners in the spooky cells and all the way to the swinging sixties.

## DIG

DIG is an exciting attraction that enables learners to engage with archaeology in a hands-on way. By becoming trainee archaeologists, pupils will learn how we use our discoveries to learn more about life in the past. A school tour at DIG will start with some archaeological training. Pupils will have a go at digging for themselves on replica excavation sites inside our DIG pits. There they can discover more about the history of York over the past 2000 years.

## Jorvik Viking Centre

Built on the very site where archaeologists discovered over 40,000 Viking-age objects, a visit to the JORVIK Viking Centre gives pupils the opportunity to learn about the real Viking settlement of Jorvik. Experience the sights, sounds and smells of Viking-age York on the site of the world-famous Coppergate Dig!

## The Shambles

Take a stroll down this iconic street. The “Shambles” is a narrow street of historic buildings, some dating back to the 13th century.

## Barley Hall

Experience what life was like in this magnificent restored medieval townhouse with the help of our friendly Barley Hall servants. A visit to Barley Hall allows students to become immersed in life in a wealthy merchant's townhouse in the Middle Ages. Learn about the Snawsell family who lived here towards the end of the medieval period. You can discover how the remains of their home were uncovered and restored.

## York Minster

# What's on the menu?

The residential package includes a full board meals service covering breakfast, packed lunch, and a two-course evening meal.

**Breakfast** is a buffet, with guests choosing items from a range of cooked food (sausage, bacon, hash brown, tomato, beans, scrambled eggs and vegetarian sausage), continental pastries, cereal, yoghurt, fruit juice, along with tea and coffee.
