## The Venue

Grinton Lodge is a 19th-century former shooting lodge that has been a youth hostel since 1948. It is a Grade II listed building, situated above the village of Grinton, in beautiful Swaledale, just 9 miles from the market town of Richmond, North Yorkshire.

Staying at Grinton offers groups the opportunity to stay in an historic building in a unique landscape. Swaledale is one of the most northerly of the Yorkshire Dales with wild and unspoilt scenery. Many of the villages and tiny hamlets – still carry the names given to them by Viking farmers who settled here over a thousand years ago.

The Lodge has **77 beds** over 20 rooms, 5 of which are en-suite. All the none en-suite rooms have a wash basin with access to shared shower and toilet facilities close by.



## All-inclusive Packages

These great value, all-inclusive curricular linked residential visits are delivered in partnership with YHA Grinton Lodge and are renowned for their high quality and value for money – **we include all coach travel, accommodation, meals, plus your chosen activities.**

**2 nights / 3 days** – Arriving at lunchtime on **Day 1** – departing at lunchtime on **Day 3** – activities are delivered during the mornings, afternoons, and evenings. Starting with the afternoon on **Day 1**.

## The Programmes

# The Discovery Programme

Includes a fabulous range of activities and team challenges.  
Choose from:

## Reeth Guided Walk – Duration 2–3 hours

A guided walk takes the group down through the fields into Grinton, before heading up towards Fremington edge (or along the river for a shorter route) and into Reeth. Here groups can spend time on the Village green, souvenir shop, and most popular of all, a visit to the ice cream shop.

## Moorland Guided Walk – Duration 2–3 hours

The second option for a guided walk is to take a hike across the Moors, this route takes the group across the undulating paths of the moorland through grouse filled heather, past historic lead mills, hidden hunting bunts and finally to a disused lead smelting furnace. This is an amazing walk for urban groups as it really takes the young people out to a different world.

## Impacts of Development – Duration 4 ½ hours + Evening activity

This activity follows the route of the Moorland walk, but with a different emphasis. The pupils will be split into groups and each group will be given a different character. Each of these characters have a different plan for an area of moorland that is up for sale. In character the groups learn about the unique habitats and environments and the pros and cons of development.

**Evening Activity** – Once back at the hostel the group set about creating a presentation to convince the 'Town Council' that their development plans or conservation ideas are the ones that should be approved.

## Archery – Duration 1 ½ hours

Pupils learn all about archery. The whole group will be given a safety demo and shown how to shoot correctly. Each participant will then shoot their arrows under guidance and tuition.

## Fire Lighting – Duration 1 ½ hours

An introduction to the art of safe fire lighting, pupils will be taught about the fire triangle, and historic methods of starting fires before they build their own campfire using a flint and steel.

## Shelter Building – Duration 1 ½ hours

Learn the art of making an outdoor shelter using various resources. Different designs will be shown to the group and practiced, before each team is provided with a scenario to design and build a shelter for. Shelter Building – Duration 1 ½ hours

## Orienteering – Duration 1 ½ hours

Tackle Grinton's own orienteering course. Learn the basic skills of map reading and orienteering before setting off on our course. A great way to encourage team building whilst giving the group some independence.

## Team Challenges – Duration 1 ½ hours

It's all about building teamwork! Pupils will be taken through a series of different team challenges each designed to test different aspects of teamwork. Sessions include giant skis, marble run, inner tube challenge, swamp crossing and more.

## Environmental Art – Duration 1 ½ hours

This activity enables pupils to create their own ephemeral natural masterpieces. Using natural material found around the hostel grounds, children create their own inspired artwork.

## Map Skills – Duration 1 ½ hours

Pupils are taught the basic skills of map reading as well as more complicated aspects such as 4 and 6 figure grid references and how to take a compass bearing. The group then compete against the clock to finish the compass bearing challenge in the fastest

# Evening Activities

## Campfire – Duration 1 ½ hours

What better way to complete your day than sitting out under the stars with a roaring campfire? The on-site will build and lead a campfire session, including campfire songs, skits and toasted marshmallows.

## Rokit Launch – Duration 1 ½ hours

Pupils build and design their own rocket with an 'egg' payload. Rockets are then part filled with water and using a track pump, launched into space. Can the egg return safely from orbit?

## Night Hike – Duration 1 ½ hours

An exciting torchlit walk over a short section of the moors to watch the sun go down and the stars come out. Although not far from the hostel, this will feel like a million miles from anywhere for the pupils.

# The Alex Rider Spy Themed Programme

# Why choose Grinton?

The Lodge is an incredible and historic venue, the type of location that most pupils will not ever have had the chance to experience. Grinton Lodge is ideally situated for walking on the nearby open moorland and to the nearby village of Reeth via the river Swale. There is plenty of safe outdoor space to enjoy the fresh air and take part in activities, areas including a large courtyard to the front of the building and a large garden area to the rear.

## What can we eat?

The package includes a **full board meals service for groups** covering breakfast, packed lunch, and a two-course evening meal.

**Breakfast** is a buffet, served by members of the team, with guests choosing items from a range of cooked food (**sausage, bacon, hash brown, tomato, beans, scrambled eggs and vegetarian sausage**), continental pastries, cereal, yoghurt, fruit juice, along with tea and coffee.

**Packed lunches** consist of a pre-ordered sandwich, a piece of fruit, a biscuit bar and a bag of crisps. Please note that as part of YHA's commitment to reducing plastic waste, bottled drinks are not provided – however a water refilling station is available and we recommend that all guests bring a bottle to fill and refill.

**Evening meals** vary on different days, and an **example** two-course evening meal would consist of the following options:

**Red tractor pork sausage with gravy and mash with vegetables**

– 915 kcal

**Vegetarian Cumberland sausage with gravy and mash with vegetables (v)** – 787 kcal

**Jacket potato with cheese & beans (optional) (v)** – 657 kcal

**Mini doughnuts with salted caramel sauce (v)** – 285 kcal

**Choc ice (v)** – 171 kcal

**Fresh fruit (v)**

The team can cater for most allergies and other dietary requirements with advanced notice. Group leaders are sent meal choice forms ahead of the visit to allow participants to make their choices and return them along with details of any dietary requirements.



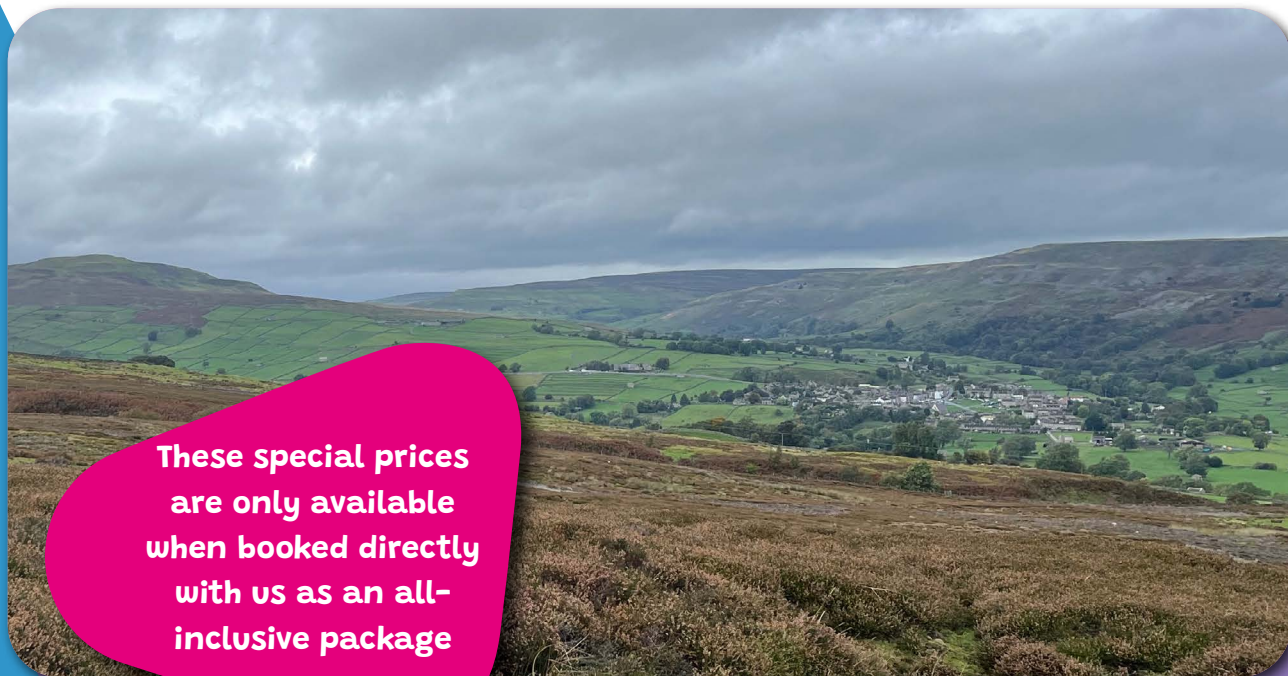
