Venues available:

FSC Blencathra: The Blencathra Centre occupies a dramatic setting at 300m on a south facing slope of Blencathra in the Lake District National Park and offers an unparalleled panorama across the Keswick, Helvellyn and Skiddaw areas. Fieldwork opportunities at Blencathra take place in and amongst the rugged fells, magnificent glaciated valleys, and nestling villages and towns creating this view. The Centre generates its own hydro-electric power and is heated using renewable biomass. The centre offers excellent facilities for schools and groups.



FSC Castle Head: Castle Head is located in south Cumbria between the coast of Morecambe Bay and the Lake District National Park. The Centre is easily accessible and only an hour and a half by coach from both Manchester and Liverpool. With easy access to both the coastline of Morecambe Bay, the glaciated uplands of the southern Lake District and the lakes of Windermere and Coniston, Castle Head is ideally situated for a wide range of both field studies and on-site activities.



FSC Malham Tarn: Malham Tarn is based around a Georgian fishing lodge situated on the northern shore of Malham Tarn and is surrounded by the 147-hectare Malham Tarn National Nature reserve, which along with the Centre buildings is owned and managed by the National Trust. The Centre itself has accommodation for 105 guests in rooms across three buildings, two thirds of which are ensuite, including one fully accessible bedroom.
